1. The Curse of Shame 25 Both the man and his wife were naked, yet felt no shame. Genesis 2:25

What is shame? "The deep sense that you are unacceptable because of something you did or something done to you, or something associated with you. You feel exposed and humiliated." Ed Welch (Shame Interrupted)

#### a. Where it comes from?

7 Then the eyes of both of them were opened, and they knew they were naked; so they sewed fig leaves together and made coverings for themselves.

Genesis 3:7

#### b. What are its affects?

9 So the Lord God called out to the man and said to him, "Where are you?" 10 And he said, "I heard you in the garden, and I was afraid because I was naked, so I hid." Genesis 3:9-10

12 The man replied, "The woman you gave to be with me—she gave me some fruit from the tree, and I ate." Genesis 3:12

#### 2. The Cure of Shame

17 In this, love is made complete with us so that we may have confidence in the day of judgment, because as he is, so also are we in this world. 18 There is no fear in love; instead, perfect love drives out fear, because fear involves punishment. So the one who fears is not complete in love.

1 John 4:17-18

a. Where it comes from? 10 Love consists in this: not that we loved God, but that He loved us and sent his Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins.

1 John 4:10

#### b. What are its affects?

17 In this, love is made complete with us so that we may have confidence in the day of judgment, because as he is, so also are we in this world.

1 John 4:17

19 We love because he first loved us. 20 If anyone says, "I love God," and yet hates his brother or sister, he is a liar. For the person who does not love his brother or sister whom he has seen cannot love God whom he has not seen.

1 John 4:19-20
